Some very exciting news is happening in the AFGC! We are going to have a State Flower Show! The Home Builder's Association of Greater Little Rock has offered us space in the Central Arkansas Home and Garden Show to have our State Flower Show. It will be at the Arkansas State Fairgrounds in the Hall of Industry on February 21-22, 2025.

Staging and set up will be on Wednesday, February 19, Horticulture and Designs will be accepted on the morning of Thursday, February 20, with judging that afternoon. The actual show will be on February 21-22. Take down on Sunday, February 23. The times are approximate right now but the dates are final. This will be a STATE show representing all of Arkansas and we have very little lead time. The AFGC will need help from every club in Arkansas to make this a success. As the first flower show since COVID-19, this will be a wonderful opportunity to learn how it's done. We will need all the help we can get. I know we all want it to be perfect and reflect favorably on the AFGC. It is the expectation of the NGC that every club participate in

a State Flower Show, and it is part of the requirements to get an award from the NGC.

There are many ways to accomplish this. Your club can send horticulture, a design, donate money to help pay for necessary materials such as ribbons, decorations, entry cards, and printing or send volunteers to help set up. If your club has never had a flower show, this will be a wonderful opportunity to learn how it's done. We will need all the help we can get. Teresa Shannon, our State Flower Show Chairman, is working hard to complete the schedule and get it out to all the clubs. As soon as it is ready, I will send a schedule to each club president. This is an exciting development and I am looking forward to working with all of you to make this the best Flower Show ever.

In other news, I just finished my farewell tour of the districts. I love the district meetings in October. I would encourage everyone to attend at least their district meetings. It's a great place to learn new ideas for your club and catch up on what's happening in your district and the AFGC. Two of the districts had Flower Shows in connection with their meetings.
